SALVATION ARMY MOBILE FEEDING UNIT SERVES THE CITY'S POOR

Operates on Chicago streets daily, feeding 14,000 people each month

WHO: Lieutenant Colonel David Grindle, Divisional Commander of The Salvation Army

WHAT: The Salvation Army's Mobile Feeding Unit

Lt. Colonel David E. Grindle will travel with the mobile feeding unit to deliver meals to the hungry and the homeless. The Salvation Army's Mobile Feeding Unit travels throughout the city to feed those in need hot, nutritional meals. The Mobile Feeding program has been in existence for 30 years and through the program, The Salvation Army is able to feed approximately 14,000 people monthly.

Colonel Grindle will also provide an update on the results of The Salvation Army's Red Kettle Christmas Campaign fundraising efforts during the turbulent economy, and what we expect of the upcoming year.
